Keeping Portshole flying

It is about a year since my husband, Ken, took responsibility for mowing and maintaining the CADMAC flying field at Portshole. The grass on the patch needs mowing every week or so and I usually go along to help.



My main task is to remove the mole hills before Ken gets to them with the mower.

The moles have the run of the place and there are usually 20 mole hills or more and numerous rabbit scrapes to deal with. It is best to remove the mole hills completely, if you just spread out the soil it kills the grass underneath. I managed to get grass seed to grow on some the bare patches in the autumn, but so far this spring it has been too dry for the grass to re-establish. I will try again in the autumn.

The owner of Portshole Farm rents the grazing to a local shepherd. By the end of June, the sheep were getting hungry and the grass round the patch was getting long. So, with an electric fence round the whole field the sheep were able to move in. With these living 'mowers' in charge we took the CADMAC mower to be serviced. But we still had to go down regularly to clear the sheep 'bumbles' from the patch. The sheep did move back to their other field when fliers arrived. The sheep have now been moved elsewhere but will probably be back in the autumn.



COVID19: By arrangement with the owner we were able to keep the grass mown during 'lockdown'. It was good when flying resumed in June with social distanced 'set-up spots' in the pits area. (note with current COVID restrictions there is no access to the barn, we have the barn door open to get the mowing kit)

I really enjoy going to Portshole with Ken. The air always feels so fresh - but maybe that is because we tend to go when it is too windy for flying!
