Statement of Accounts 2007-2008

The Statement of Accounts shows the income and expenditure for the year together with the asset value of the Club.

Expenditure during the year was principally on normal running costs such as the annual licence cost of our flying sites, Fishbourne Club membership, Clear Dope, general postage and stationery and other routine overheads.

"One off costs" were the EGM, Goodwood VFE event and a display banner for CADMAC. If these costs are deducted, then total expenditure was \pounds 8,370.66. Note therefore that our income from subscriptions (\pounds 8,408.00) just covers our overheads and we rely on fund raising activities and donations to produce any surplus, which this year was + \pounds 393.71.

The Accounts show that the asset value of the Club is £8,078.61 (compared with £7,500.85 for the previous year). Of this, £6,293.61 is cash in the deposit and current accounts and in petty cash. Stock in hand (£400) includes £325 of unused Cartridges/toner for the Club CD printer. These will be used during the coming year.

Book assets of $\pounds1,215.00$ listed in Section3 are the depreciated value of the equipment which the Club owns, such as grass cutters, printer, various monitors and so on.

Membership at early November was 155;an increase over the last six years.

2008 Indoor Duration Nationals

19th, 20th & 21st September 2008 - RAF Digby, Lincolnshire.

Having been to the Dutch and French Indoor meetings, then attendance at our own National Championships was mandatory.

I duly used the Internet to find out where Digby is and how to get there. Whilst doing this I browsed the net for information on Lincolnshire.

In Noel Cowards play, "Private Lives," is the well known expression, "very flat Norfolk".

Well I can only assume that the playwright had never to Lincolnshire, because it (Lincolnshire) is flat, most of the county being only a few yards above sea-level.

And if Sweyn Forkbeard, Viking King of both Denmark and England, had not fallen from his horse (in Gainsborough) and died, then his son Canute would not have become king, and his attempt at turning back the tide at Bosham may never have occurred. Just goes to show, stick to what you are good at. Vikings were good at rowing, not very good at National Hunt events.

Likewise, if King John had used the A1, instead of the mud flats of the Wash, he may not have contracted dysentery, which caused him to stay at Sleaford Abbey, where he was poisoned by a monk ,dying later at Newark.

Enough of what ifs.

RAF Digby is the oldest station in the RAF, having been established in 1918. Home to a Canadian squadron during WW2, the station is now a communications link as well a training school.

By kind permission of the Station Commander, the BMFA have use of the gymnasium For indoor scale and duration flying. The gymnasium is housed within a WW2 hangar, with an excellent floor, plenty of space and a 30' ceiling.

I had entered three classes. F1M, F1L and LRS.

In the F1M class I was flying a new model, "Bigfoot" designed by Derek Richards. Class spec. is span 46cms, minimum weight 3gms and a maximum rubber weight of 1.500 gms. I have found a source of light indoor wood and managed to get Bigfoot down to 3.8gms. This is still 0.8 Gms above minimum weight of 3.0gms but it is a step in the right direction. Luckily for me Derek was at the meeting and I was able to benefit from his design and trimming philosophy.

Six contest flights were allowed in each class, with the two best times to count. The Nationals is not the best place to trim a new model, but it is a far from perfect world. Each flight would be another step on the learning curve.

Shame and embarrassment for me, when on my second flight my model was put in the "Parc Ferme" for scrutinizing, and the motor was found to be overweight. Class rules stipulate a maximum rubber weight of 1.50 gms, mine weighed 1.59gms. 10

Undeterred by this setback, I cut a new motor, made sure it was within limits, and re-entered the fray.

My two best flight times were 6mins 21 secs, and 6 mins 41 secs, which gave me second place overall, thirteen seconds behind the winner. Mrs E Robinson from Ulster.

In F1L my two best times of 6 mins 04secs and 7 mins 01secs put me in seventh place, no match for Bob Baileys 'winning times of 14 min. and 13 min 04 secs.

LRS is a frustrating class. Wing span of 7" and minimum weight of 0.43 Gms.

The challenge is to stop them going through the roof and yet record a decent fliaht time.

My model weighs 0.5gms and my two best times were 3mins. 03 secs and 3min.08 secs which put me in fifth position.

Ron Wilson won the class with times of 6min.04 .secs and 5 min.47 secs.

In the F1D class Mark Benn's winning time was 26min 36 secs, and I do not intend to even contemplate building for that class.

All told a most enjoyable and educational weekend.
