Safety Officer's report.

Morris C stated that he was very pleased with the general safety performance at Thorney in view of the new pits layout. Bill Silk, who flew as a guest at Thorney last Sunday brought with him a very beautiful DC3 powered by twin Laser engines and also a large Edge aerobatic model. He also reported that Derek Honeyset should be congratulated on obtaining his 'B Certificate that day.

Morris and Tony C re-affirmed the club's policy that all club members should be at least A-certificated to fly unaccompanied. It was mentioned that a number of flyers of a competent standard to achieve 'A'-rating had not done so, and were continuing to fly models unaccompanied. This must stop. Tony C stipulated the classes of membership competent to accompany a non 'A'-rated flyer. These are:- A club approved instructor. Aclub nominated instructor with 'A' certification. All 'B' certificated members. Examiners.

Porthole Farm representative's report.

A short report from Steve S was read out by Ray B. All mowing and cutting of trees and stumps has been completed by the farmer (Raife) and the rubbish has been burnt. He will be in the process of mowing the grass area this week. Post meeting note:- Steve S telephoned to report that Robert Stone has successfully passed his 'A' test at Porthole this week.

Competition Secretary's report Ray B stated that the slope competition fixture has been arranged for Saturday 13^{th} June at 12pm. The long term weather forecast suggests that the wind direction may not be optimal for the event. The last competition, the Scramble Event, was held on the 23^{rd} May and attended by 12 competitors.

There were two non-finishers. Ray himself won the scramble in a time of 33 secs for the 3 loops. Last years event was won by Steve Skinner with a time of 27 secs.

The club's Electric Event is scheduled for 11th July at 12.00 noon at Thorney. There will be different competitions scheduled for all manner of different types of models ranging from park flyers to performance electric. So everyone is requested to come and support this event.

Ken K stated that there is also an electric fly-in scheduled at Winchester on the 21st June. Please see the SBMFA website for details. There was some discussion about the merits of dedicating the whole afternoon's event at Thorney solely to electric. Tony C stated that this was purely for the duration of the competition and that members could fly IC power after the event had concluded, if required. There was also some further discussion about contingency if the weather was not suitable for electric flying. The suggestion is to bring an IC model as an alternative if the wind is likely to be high and the event has to be postponed.

Indoor Flying representative's report.

Allen M reported that the Seaford College event scheduled for Saturday 27th June has been postponed to the following Saturday 4th July (1-5pm) due to a conflict of events at the College. Nothing further to report.

Trundle Hill representative's report.

Fred M stated that little if any flying had taken place at the Trundle during the past month since the prevailing wind had consistently been in the wrong direction for flying.

Website report.

Members will have noticed the club's website has disappeared even though the subscription monies have been paid. Tony C stated that according to the website policy, the club's right to the site will be retained for a period of 9 weeks. Mike P is in contact with previous webmaster, Lee Hackett, in order to try to sort out the situation with the domain holder. One interim possibility is to make use of the SBMFA website for important events or news items. Allen M suggested that the club could use a temporary website belonging to one of the committee members for the time being, with a suitable tag being incorporated into the SBMFA website to vector to it. This would not be a .co.uk or a .com type but at least would be usable.

Thorney Island representative report.

Derek H stated that the general usage of the field start up area and pilots' box arrangement has been found to work and been generally well accepted. In view of the invited guest, Bill Silk from Border Club, who flew at the field last Sunday 31st May and was signed in by Ken K the question was raised about the number of times a guest flyer can be invited to the club fields). Tony C re-affirmed that the BMFA insurance rules and, therefore, the club's policy is that any **uninsured** guest can be invited to fly a maximum of 3 times. Any BMFA **insured** guest can, theoretically, be invited an unlimited number of times to the field at the club committee's discretion, provided that in each case the guest flyer form is filled in.



TANGMERE 39

The Museum's main Special Event this year is to be called Tangmere 39 and will mark the 70th anniversary of the outbreak of WW2. It will be held on July 19th, opening at 10am, and promises to be a great day out.

Star billing in the biggest flying display we have ever put on will be a Battle of Britain Flight Hurricane to represent the type of RAF fighter aircraft stationed at Tangmere in September '39 when war broke out. There will also be flying displays by a Tiger Moth, one of the main basic training types during WW2, a Harvard advanced trainer and a Chipmunk.

Other attractions on the day will include an art exhibition, open cockpits so that visitors can sit in some of the Museum's aircraft, various stalls, live '30s and '40s music from Play it again Sam, cars of the period, flight simulators and all the Museum's normal attractions.

Tickets for our richest ever Grand Prize Draw will be on sale throughout the day.
