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Scramble Competition 21st May 2011

Were was everybody? after several phone calls I discovered the Ray Beadle was indisposed and Tony had forgotten about the comp., so unfortunately the competition did not take place.

During the phone calls I contacted Bruce Smith and told him the competition was off so he and Morris Campbell joined us , Morris bought along his new model, a compilation of various incarnations of Mustangs christened the Six Shooter powered by an OS Gemini 160 twin which sounded the part and the plane flew well until when the flying down wind leg of the landing approach there was a load bang, the spinner and prop flew off and with all the drag caused buy the ensuing large hole in the front of the plane more or less fell out of the sky causing a fair amount of damaged to the underside of the plane. Morris however managed to retract the under carriage just before impact. What caused the engine to fail well once Morris got the plane home he discovered there that one of the con-rods had sheared and seized the engine causing the propeller(Flywheel) to depart the aircraft!

4th International Indoor Fly-in, Jan Massinkhal, Nijmegen, Netherlands. May 21-22.

Another great weekend of Indoor Flying. Twenty five modelers from five countries created a friendly and enjoyable atmosphere for this event.

The opportunity to have two whole days of uninterrupted free flight competition is not to be missed.

The Jan Massinkhal is a Cat1, hall just under eight metres to a smooth almost unobstructed ceiling. With a floor area of two thousand four hundred square metres both scale and duration fliers co-exist quite happily.

For the F4-D competition all other flying was suspended and Lutz Schramm from Germany posted a provisional World Record for a Cat 1 hall with a time of thirty two minutes and seven seconds. This now goes to the FAI for ratification.

As well as flying in Peanut and Pistachio I entered Sainte Formula. This is based on the Bostonian concept and is an interesting class. This was the first chance I have had to

really put some turns into the rubber and fly under a smooth ceiling without fear of

hanging up on girders, pipes and ducting which bedevil indoor flying in the U.K.

I thought I was doing well with two thousand turns but the class winner was Marieke Wegen

who calmly said she managed three thousand turns, and yes she flew twice as long as I did, nearly forty one and half minutes. Now that I know what this model is capable of I may well try again.

Blackbushe May 14th 2011

I attended the Blackbushe show on behalf of the Southern Area of the BMFA. The weather was unusually good for the event with an apparently good attendance and the trade stalls seemed to be doing well. Two model clubs put on displays of models, Aldershot and Basingstoke, Aldershot in particular put on a very good display of models including an I/C powered Lancaster, Aldershot is a very active club in most aspects of R/C Flying and is under the Chairmanship of Peter Carter <u>www.aldershotmc.com</u>.

The flying display was excellent however the vast majority of the models being displayed could not be described as club models for instance 'PariTech GmbH ' were flying gliders most of which were for sale at a cost from 600€ to 3600€ and the Jodel Robin tug had a price tag of 3890€ bare ! The most impressive by far was an Aldershot club member, Steve Prideaux flying a BMV Bandit, the plane was very very fast, very quiet and flown exceptionally well.

Imagine if you will flying at a height of six foot knife edge at a speed of 250mph!!! Steve by the way is an air-traffic controller at Swanwick Air Traffic control centre.
