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Bomb Drop Competition 2016

It was a sunny day, with a light breeze from the SW

There were Eleven pilots this year. Models were electric and I/C powered.

Three rounds were flown. The nearest distance from the spot was to be the winner.

Ray Beadle started the 1st round and made a distance of 162 ft with his I/c Cougar, Keith Watts then flew electric Riot and got 13 ft, James Egington was next with his Red Bull trainer and managed 22ft 6ins. while Eamon Keating with his Visionair made 39ft 11ins. David Gardner flying a Tundra got to 81ft and then Declan Cousins, who had made vertical landing with his second hand Gringo when testing, flew Eamon's Visionair to a distance of 64ft, he was followed by Ken Knox and his I/c Acrowot, with a large bomb fitted with sticky tape, which came off when turning over the sea!! He was given 1000ft. Mick Blundell flew the Visionair of Eamon and got a very good 6ft 10ins while Tony Coombs with his I/c Cougar did 88ft 5ins. Peter Turley was next with his A300 and managed 219ft, last to fly this round was Jeremy Stuttard and his Pulse with a distance of 15ft 3ins.

In the 2nd round, James was best with7ft 2ins followed by Declan with 9ft 2ins and Mike with 13ft 11ins.

In the 3rd round Ray did best with 4ft 6ins, Tony managed 9ft 6ins while Keith got to 11ft 6ins

So with the nearest the winner over the three rounds, the results were,

- 2nd Mick Blundell
- 3rd James Egington

It was a grand day, I hope more will come and join us. Thanks to Keith and Declan who helped with measuring and all who came and enjoyed it.

Hi all, I'm about to put my jet on Ebay but thought I'd give club members first refusal.

An ideal opportunity for anyone wishing to start up in jet flying. The FB Model 'Super Falcon' makes a perfect marriage with a Wren turbine in the 'Goldcat 54' combining trainer like handing qualities in takeoff, flight and landing with a sparkling performance when you throw the taps wide open.

The original 'Wren 54' turbine was upgraded by Wren to a 'Super Sport' and then an auto-start ECU and components added so there's no messing with gas taps and starter motors. It has clocked up approximately 10.5 hours running time most of which was on the ground.

The Goldcat stats are: Wingspan 64 inches Length 76 inches

It comes complete with 9 servos, two solenoid valves, air retracts including steerable, retracting nose wheel, hand-held data terminal, 10 litre fuel tank with electric fill/empty controls and all model and turbine manuals, receipts, data sheets, paraphernalia etc. etc. Ready for you to just fit your own receiver, fill and fly.

All up weight approximately 14 lb + turbine thrust approximately 17 lb = A hell of a climb rate!

We have only had one accident this year lets make it the last. Please talk about it with your mates. Tell everybody about this crap article that should not have been allowed in print. Help others that you see being unsafe and accept that you might get a mouthful in return. Let's face it you need all your fingers to fly.
